CLASS 1W: Nicola Whitehead

Welcome to Term 4! Thank you for continuing to support your child/children with their home readers and returning them to school. It really does make a difference when students practice their reading on a regular basis at home - it has been wonderful to see their reading skills develop!

Maths this term is focused on patterns and their rules. We continue to practice counting forwards and backwards from any number, skip counting and writing our numbers correctly. We will also be looking at length, volume and collecting data this term.

In Science we are looking at the materials things are made of. We had great fun with our binoculars and spy glasses/telescopes exploring the school grounds to find things made from glass, wood or metal. Another Science topic is 'where does our food come from and whether it is natural or processed.' In History, the way different cultures celebrate special occasions and traditions will be our focus.

On Thursdays, 1W are having technology lessons with Mr Reeve and our first lesson was received with great enthusiasm. Already they are drawing pictures using apps on the laptops and having great fun at the same time.

In literacy we continue to practice our reading in reading groups and have been learning about nouns and adjectives to support our creative writing. The students are becoming independent writers by having a go at 'sounding out' words and writing the corresponding letter, remembering their finger spaces and capital letters.

Thank you, too, for your contribution in supporting your child with their News topics this term. The students are doing a great job working in groups, listening to the speaker and asking relevant questions, to then report back to the rest of the class.

CLASS 2M: Naomi Moore/Sue Campbell

Welcome to term 4! I had a lot of assessments to mark over the holidays and it was wonderful to see how much 2M students have learned! We have finished our unit on multiplication and division, but students (particularly those in year 2) are encouraged to continue learning their times table facts. Instant recall of the 2 times table, 5 times table and 4 times table is the aim. Known facts can really boost student confidence. This term we will be focusing on fractions, time and money.

In writing we are continuing our focus on vocabulary. Students are encouraged to "borrow" new words from great authors to enhance their writing. Many students will now deliberately choose a more interesting word like "stroll" rather than "walk" when writing. Some year 2 students are even using similes! This term year 2 students will be learning to organise their writing into paragraphs.

Reading at home continues to be important for all students. Research shows "parental involvement with reading activities at home has a significant positive influence not only on reading achievement, language comprehension and expressive language skills (Gest et al., 2004) but also on students' interest and motivation in reading." Hi and welcome back to Term 4. I hope everyone had a great break and are ready for a busy Term. Thank you and congratulations to all the year 3 and 4 students who have completed Reading, Mathematics and Writing Check-In Assessments (a state-wide initiative) this week. Staff will be analysing the results and determining the next steps to success. This term our school performance will be Aladdin. 3R will be the marketplace dancers and acrobats, selling scarves, jewellery and colourful materials.

During term 2 and 3 I was lucky enough to work with 3R and 4BJ each week to work with students to implement technology in their learning. This term I will be working every Thursday with 1W and 2M to implement technology (last week we drew pictures in Paint).

Due to popular demand, we will continue to read the Anh Do Series 'Weirdo' for our class novel. We are up to number 12. During term 4 we are focusing on writing Recounts and Narratives. In Spelling, this week we are focusing on the sound 'oo' as in boot, next week 'z' as in zebra and 's' as in treasure, and 'ou' as in cloud in week 4. In Maths, the next few weeks we are focusing on Number Patters (increasing and decreasing), fractions and decimals. In Geography, this term we are focusing on the Unit 'Climate and Weather'.

Home learning Unit 27 is due tomorrow (Friday 21st), in week 3 Unit 28 is due Friday 28th and in week 4 Unit 29 is due Friday 4th November. There are some students who are practising their weekly spelling words at home, could parents please make sure students are practising them daily. Just a reminder that students who are reading below PM 30 need to be taking home readers and practicing throughout the week.
