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CLASS 1W: Nicola Whitehead


In Science, 1W have been continuing to learn about what things are made of, how to sort different materials and why things are made the way they are. They have also enjoyed making their own 'Foods of the World' book with Ms Garden.


In literacy, we have been practising our independent writing skills by creating our own monsters and writing full sentences about them using adjectives. It is wonderful seeing the students' creativity. Our 'pumpkin' activity on Halloween also saw some imaginative creations!

In maths we have been learning how to share items into groups and making it fair. Arranging items into rows has been helping students count more efficiently (in 2s, 5s or 10s or subitising) to calculate the total number of items, whilst providing them with the foundations to learn multiplication. We have had lots of hands on water fun learning about capacity too!

The current Kindergarten students are looking forward to welcoming the pre-schoolers to their first transition day, whilst the Year 1s get to transition into 2M for the session.

Gymnastics this week has also been exciting news for everyone!





CLASS 2M: Naomi Moore/Sue Campbell

This week in 2M students have continued their work with shadow puppets. This has provided lots of wonderful opportunities for discussion, drama and writing. We have been learning to write and read words focusing on the /ow/ sound, for example: cow, how, now, town and for year 2 students: sound, mouse, ground, flower. Students have been learning about the many compound words in our language: friendship, teaspoon, handbag and football, to name just a few!

In maths we have finished our unit of work on fractions and will be learning about telling the time starting next week. Fractions provide important foundation knowledge for telling the time. Students will be able to relate what they have learned about halves and quarters to the terms "half past" and "quarter past."

In Science and Technology students are learning about digital systems with Ms Garden and technology with Mr Reeve. Gymnastic started today with Yvette and Zoey from Eden Area Gymnastics at the town hall!

Candelo Public School students have been lucky enough to start Gymnastics in the Candelo Hall today. Each class will have 3 x 1-hour sessions for the next 3 weeks with the staff from Eden Gymnastics improving their skills, then on Thursday 1st December the whole school will travel to Eden Gymnastics (in Pambula) for an onsite session.

All students from 3R and 4BJ will travel to Bermagui for a concert at Four Winds on Friday 11th November.

The last few weeks 3R have been writing Narratives, focusing on writing detailed descriptions for characters and the settings. In Spelling, this week we are focusing on the sound 'ou' as in cloud, next week 'ch' as in chicken and 'sh' as in shell, and 'oy' as in boy and 'eer' as in deer in week 6. In Maths, the next week we will be doing some testing for reports as well as measuring litres/millilitres focusing on in containers and measuring grams/kilograms of objects. Home learning Unit 29 is due tomorrow (Friday 4th), in week 5 Unit 30 is due (Friday 11th) and in week 6 Unit 31 is due (Friday 18th).

4BJ have been on an epic adventure!


